## WHAT \$10 WILL DO

Provide 30 minutes of respite care to a caregiver/family member caring for a traumatic brain injury survivor
Provide three hot meals served at a shelter or mobile feeding site
Pay for 10 rounds on the Tuscaloosa Trolley for transportation to prevocational training and employment
Buy five canvases for art therapy class
Cover the cost of one Little to attend a movie or field trip with BBBS or a one-on-one trip with their Big
Provide supplies for a group of boys for a weekly meeting
Cover the cost of a summer field trip for one child
Cover the costs of snacks for one day
Buy crib sheets for parents in the Nurturing Baby/ Safe Sleep program
Buy books for children ages 2-5 in the Parents as Teachers program
Provide a therapeutic toy for use in play therapy with troubled children
Purchase non-perishable food items for Five Horizon's Food Bank
Buy two round trips for medical and shopping purposes for a senior in need
Purchase a Girl Scout membership and world association pin
Buy a 90-day supply of medications for patients
Purchase various steroid, pain, stomach reflux, and antihistamine medications
Purchase a client's personal hygiene products
Provide a meal for a family of five
Provide a two-month supply of antibiotics to an infant that has Sickle Cell
Buy personal hygiene items like feminine products, soap, toothpaste, etc.
Provide a "personal kit" that is given to clients upon their arrival at the shelter
Buy school supplies for children in the after-school program
Buy arts and crafts supplies
Basic school supplies for one child for a nine-week grading period
